Introduction

Through the generosity of individuals and organizations, scholarships have been established at Barstow Community College. These Scholarships recognize outstanding performance and assist students in pursuing their educational goals. Last year more than \$76,000 in scholarship funds were awarded.

This booklet contains descriptions of the general scholarships and awards, as well as award amounts, application deadlines, and criteria for consideration. To aid in your search for scholarship funding, we have included a listing of private and community scholarships that require separate applications, scholarship information for four-year institutions, and other scholarship resources.

How To Apply

Each scholarship has its own criteria, read carefully through this booklet to determine if your qualifications match those listed. Scholarship qualifications and award amounts are subject to change in accordance with the wishes of the donor(s), decisions of scholarship committees, fluctuations in the financial market, and/or changes in the policies of the organization. You may apply for any scholarships for which you meet the criteria. The application used for the Barstow College Foundation and Barstow Community College Scholarships can be found enclosed in this booklet and can also be downloaded from Barstow Community College's web site at:

Please submit an original signed copy of the application, along with the personal essay, two Recommendation Forms, and your high school transcripts. You need only submit college transcripts from other institutions if your Barstow Community College Transcript is incomplete. Students who fail to turn in required documents may not be eligible for consideration. The complete Scholarship Application must be submitted to Financial Aid at the Barstow or Ft. Irwin campus no later than 5pm on Friday, March 13, 2009. Once submitted, your application becomes the property of Barstow Community College and will be judged as is.

DEFINITIONS:

New Students: graduating high school seniors and other entering freshmen.

Continuing Student: students who in the Fall 2009 semester will be returning to BCC.

Returning Students: second year or continuing BCC students.

Transferring Students: students who will be transferring from Barstow Community College to a four-year college or university in the fall of 2009.

Deadline

Applications for general scholarships must be received by the Financial Aid Office either on main campus or at Ft. Irwin no later than 5pm on Friday, March 13, 2009.

SPECIAL NOTE: Scholarships offered by other organizations may have different deadlines and award dates. Please read each description carefully for specific information.

After You Apply

Scholarship committees or benefactors screen the applications to select the most qualified students for each award. Scholarship recipients are invited to Honors Day once the screening process for all scholarships has been completed. Students should thank their perspective donor with a thank you card or letter. Barstow Community College will also send a thank you letter to the scholarship donors.

Awards Ceremony

The week of April 15, 2009, recipients will be invited to attend Honors Day to be held in the James R. Parks Memorial Gymnasium on May 1, 2009 at 6pm. Scholarship recipients will learn which scholarships they have won at the ceremony. It is strongly recommended that named recipients make every effort to attend the ceremony. Helpful Hints

1. Make a copy of the application to use as a rough draft. Additional applications can be obtained from Financial Aid or downloaded from Barstow Community College's web site at: <http://www.barstow.edu/FinancialAid/scholarships.asp>.
2. Keep this booklet. The guidelines and rules of the scholarships are listed here for your reference. You may need to refer to them after the March 13, 2009 deadline.
3. Plan ahead in order to meet the application deadline. Deadlines for other scholarships vary greatly. We strongly suggest the you request information and applications as soon as possible so that you do not miss an early deadline.
4. Recommendation Forms are essential to your application. Consider that the person you may ask to recommend you will need time to complete it. We recommend that you allow at least a week.
5. Typed applications are preferred. Applications can be typed and printed online at: <http://www.barstow.edu/FinancialAid/scholarships.asp>.
6. If requesting an application from a community or general scholarship, be sure to include a self-addressed stamped envelope.

7. If an official academic transcript is required be sure to request it at least 10 days prior to the scholarship deadline.

8. Answer all questions asked on the application. Be sure to sign your application package. The Scholarship Committee is unable to obtain your transcripts or share application information if your application package is unsigned.

9. Complete the application as neatly as possible. Remember to proofread your application and personal essay for spelling, grammatical, and typographical errors. Your application should present your qualifications as the best candidate.

10. Your personal essay is very important. The Scholarship Committee and other donors use the statement to learn more about you as an individual and to understand your experiences, accomplishments, and beliefs. This statement gives you the opportunity to discuss attributes and experiences that may not be evident through a review of your academic records. Type a statement about yourself on a separate paper using no more than two sheets of paper. Below is a list of items that you might consider covering in your statement.

- Catch the judges' attention. Start your essay in a unique way. Find something that will distinguish you from the other applicants.
- Discuss your interest in your intended major, how you developed your interest in this field and state your educational and career goals.
- Provide information about your family and work experience. List any unusual personal or family circumstances of special consideration.
- Provide information about your school and your involvement in community service.
- State why it is important for you to receive this scholarship.
- Elaborate on any "qualifying statement" you have made. (For each example, if you select the qualifying statement that you have a career goal to be a teacher, include the information in your personal essay.

11. Make a copy of your entire scholarship application for your records.

Associated Student Body Scholarship

Open to students who are freshmen or sophomores at Barstow Community College. Student must have been a member, officer, or senator in ASB for the 2008-2009 school year and participated in its activities, while maintaining a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0. Scholarships will be awarded upon verification of enrollment in fall 2009 at Barstow Community College or the college in which the graduating ASB member will attend in the fall of 2009.

Amount: Five scholarships of \$300

Barstow College Faculty Association

Open to continuing and transfer students attending Barstow Community College with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0.

Barstow Community College Callboard Performing Arts Club Scholarship

Open to students who are new, continuing or plan to transfer to Barstow Community College as well as transferring to a 4-year university. Applicants must have the intent to pursue their education within the realm of the arts (Performing Arts, Fine Arts, Education, or similar field) with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (applicants must include an essay of intent).

Club Technology Scholarship

Open to new or continuing Barstow Community College students who have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 and need at least one more year of attendance before transfer or graduation and demonstrate financial need.

Open to Barstow Community College students who have completed at least one semester with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.8 to 3.5 and is in pursuit of a degree from BCC.

Dr. Joseph P. Graci Book Fund

Created in honor of Barstow Community College Spanish instructor, Dr. Joseph P. Graci, this scholarship assists working students with textbook expenses. Applicants must work a minimum of 20 hours per week, enroll in six or more units per semester, and have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5.

Open to all students currently enrolled at Barstow Community College.

Future Park Scholar Award

Open to students who are enrolled full time at Barstow Community College and plan to transfer to Park University- Fort Irwin or Park University- MCLB/Barstow in Fall 2009 pursuing a Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice, Management, Human Resources, Computer Information Systems, or Social Psychology. Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5.

Open to a Barstow Community College student with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5 and is pursuing an associate's or bachelor's degree in any science, vocational, or technology related field. Preference given to students involved in community service activities, but it is not required.

Open to all full time continuing or transfer students who have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 and plan to major in Education, Fine Arts, Performing Arts, or Vocational Arts (i.e. Culinary, Cosmetology.) Students who demonstrate financial need will be given preference.

Reeb Family Scholarship Award for Liberal Arts

The student must have completed at least two semesters (30 units) of course work at Barstow Community College with the object of completing at least one more year there and subsequently transferring to a four-year college or university. The student must have earned a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 and taken any combination of at least three courses in the humanities division (art, humanities music, philosophy, religious studies, speech, theater arts) or the social sciences division (anthropology, archeology, economics, history, political science, psychology, sociology.) The application must include an essay of no more than 500 words on why the student wishes to study in a liberal arts field, including career objectives. Amount: The award will be \$1,000 for the fall semester and an additional \$1,000 for the spring semester. The second installment will be contingent on the student maintaining a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 in the fall and enrolling in at least one course each semester from any one of the departments identified above.

Neatness including a typed essay, creativity, presentation, enthusiasm, research, and documentation count toward the Route 66 Mother Road Museum Committee's selection.
