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TRANSFER BASICS

What Does it Mean to Transfer?

"Transfer" indicates moving from one educational institution to another. We will USE the term "transfer" to describe advancement from Barstow Community College to a 4-year university.

What do I Need to do to Transfer?

- Plan a program of study with your counselor
- Work hard and do well in your courses. Focus on GPA
- Complete English & Math requirements EARLY!

How Long Does it Take to Transfer?

- Generally 2-3 years
- Several factors will impact the length of time you are at BCC: English and Math placement, selected major, # of units taken per semester, and academic progress.

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STUDENT EDUCATION PLAN—SEP



What is a Student Educational Plan?

A student educational plan or SEP provides a semester-by semester plan of classes that a student will need to take in order to complete their educational goal. The courses on the SEP may be a combination of basic skills, general education, major, and elective courses. The SEP is created in coordination with a Barstow Community College counselor.

Who needs to create an SEP?

All students need to meet with a counselor to make an educational plan that reflects what their goals are for attending BCC. Some students have specific goals while others only have a vague idea about why they are attending. Either way, students want to take the time to explore majors by creating an educational plan with a counselor.

Why create a SEP?

Planning and taking only those courses a student needs saves a lot of time and money. In addition, creating an educational plan allows students to keep their priority registration, take correct courses, and finish in the shortest amount of time, all while achieving their educational goal.

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ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT—ARTHUR RAMIREZ, AA Social Science- Transfer to UCSB



Why did you choose to transfer to UC-Santa Barbara?

"I chose to transfer to UCSB because it was one of my top choices for the UC's and actually after going there I realized that it is very student friendly, especially for student transportation, housing, and just the environment itself. I really like the location, the weather is always great, and of course you are right next to a beach, so you really can't complain. UCSB was also ranked among the top 10 in the United States so that is also a reason that I chose to go there."

What is your favorite thing about the campus?

"My favorite thing is to go to Campus Point which is a little further up on the campus and there is beautiful scenery of the beach. I like to go there with friends. That's probably my favorite thing."

Is there anything that you wish you would have known before going to UCSB that you didn't find out about until after the fact?

"Yes, that there is something called pass/no pass. Basically if there are classes that are not really that important to you, you can just set them up as pass/no pass, so that anything above a "C" is a pass and anything below is a no pass. It's better for your GPA, so I recommend it for courses that are not all that important for your major."

Do you feel that you have been challenged in your coursework at UCSB?

"Yes, yes I have! I originally started out as a Psych major and I decided to change to Global Studies with a minor in Russian. The coursework is a little harder than I expected."

Do you feel that the professors and the college staff are helpful and approachable?

"Yes, they are very approachable. They also love it when you go and see them during their office hours and talk to them about their research, they love it! The professors at UCSB are definitely approachable."

How are you adjusting to dorm life?

"I ended up getting an apartment. I like it a lot. There is more freedom living in an apartment compared to the dorms. Especially, because there is a kitchen, unlike the dorms, so you can cook at home anytime you want."

Are you involved in any extracurricular activities on campus?

"Yeah, I joined Army ROTC and I just love it. One of the main things we do is physical training three times a week. We also have an army leadership lab where we go over army tactics, values, and leadership skills."

What kind of advice would you offer to a BCC student looking to transfer to UCSB?

"There is a lot of fun stuff that goes on at UCSB, but make sure you actually read, go to class, and also make sure you actually study. It's very easy to get sidetracked by all the activities on campus. Also don't be afraid to leave your comfort zone, everything will be alright."

Minimum Transfer Requirements

- 60 transferable units
- GPA of at least 2.4 for California Residents
- Complete the seven course pattern, earning a "C" or better in each.
 - \Rightarrow Two courses of English Comp.
 - \Rightarrow One course in college level math
 - ⇒ Four courses from among at least two of the following areas. Arts & Humanities,
 Behavioral and Social Sciences, and Biological and physical sciences.

What Can You Do with a Degree in Political Science?

Degrees in political science are offered at the associate's, bachelor's, master's and doctoral levels. In these programs, students learn how government works and how to develop policy, conduct research and analyze data. Undergraduate degrees may prepare graduates for entry-level careers, but many occupations in this field call for graduate study. Students often participate in internships in order to get hands-on experience.

Skills you Acquire With this Major

Political Science majors develop skills that are applicable to a wide variety of careers. These skills include:

- Strong verbal and written communication skills
- Knowledge of worldwide political systems and processes
- Critical thinking and creative problem-solving
- Ability to formulate clear and persuasive messages
