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BASIC TRANSFER REQUIREMENTS FOR A CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY (CSU)

Who is an Upper-Division Transfer Student (UDT)?

If you will have at least 60 semester or 90 quarter transferable units completed by the time you enter a CSU, you are considered an upper-division transfer applicant.

Admission Requirements for UDT Students

To be admitted to the California State University as an upper-division transfer (UDT) student, you must:

- Have completed a minimum of 60 semester or 90 quarter units of transferable coursework;
- Have an overall college GPA of at least 2.00; your GPA is calculated using all transfer units attempted. In high-demand majors and campuses a GPA of 2.00 may not be sufficient to be admitted;
- Be in good standing at the last college or university attended. In simple terms "good standing" means you are eligible to re-enroll at your last college or university;
- Have completed 10 general education courses (30 semester units or 45 quarter units) of basic skills courses, with a grade of C- or better, and, specifically, four courses completed in the following areas;
 - \Rightarrow Oral Communication
 - SPCH-1 at Barstow Community College
 - \Rightarrow Written Communication
 - ENGL-1A at Barstow Community College
 - $\Rightarrow \ \ {\rm Critical \ Thinking}$
 - ENGL-1C at Barstow Community College
 - ⇒ Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning
 - Math-1, 2, 3, 4, or 5 at Barstow Community College







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UNIVERSITY SPOTLIGHT- CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY-SAN BERNARDINO



California State University, San Bernardino is a preeminent center of intellectual and cultural activity in Inland Southern California. Opened in 1965 and set at the foothills of the beautiful San Bernardino Mountains, the university serves more than 20,000 students each year and graduates about 4,000 students annually.

CSUSB reflects the dynamic diversity of the region and has the most diverse student population of any university in the Inland Empire, and it has the second highest African American and Hispanic enrollments of all public universities in California. Seventy percent of those who graduate are the first in their families to do so.

Admissions Requirements:

The minimum admission requirements for transfer students applying to CSUSB are 60 semester (90 quarter) units of transferable course work taken at a regionally accredited* community college or university.

Within the 60 semester (90 quarter) units, students must complete the following four basic skills courses with a grade of "C-" or better in each course:

- Freshman Composition
- College Algebra (or baccalaureate level transferable math course equivalent)
- Critical Thinking
- Speech/Oral Communication

The remaining courses for transfer come from the CSU/IGETC General Education Transfer Pattern (at least 30 semester/45 quarter units), and the from the major).

What Can You Do with a Degree in Sociology?

As a graduate with a sociology degree, you will have a foundation for better understanding and engaging with the globalizing world. You will be equipped with the tools needed to make sense of the shifting social world and contribute solutions to difficult social problems.

Given the breadth, adaptability and utility of studying sociology, employment opportunities abound for graduates who have an B.A.. degree in sociology. The following list of possibilities is only illustrative — many other paths may be open to you and additional education or training may be required. *Careers in Sociology,* a publication of the <u>American Sociological Association</u>, identifies these employment sectors:

- Business- public relations, marketing and sales, consumer research, human resources, insurance, real estate, training, entrepreneurship, and media.
- Community Services non-profit agencies, urban planning, childcare, community development, environmental groups, and advocacy.
- Health Services family planning substance abuse education, rehabilitation counseling, hospital admissions, and insurance providers.
- **Higher Education** admissions, advising, alumni relations, development, and administrative support.
- Law- law enforcement, investigations, probation and parole administration, criminal justice, judicial affairs, attorney, and paralegal.
- **Publishing** Professional writing, research, editing, and journalism.
- **Social Services** rehabilitation, case management, youth and elderly services, recreation, administration, social work, and local, state and federal agencies.
- Teaching— elementary, secondary, special education, and teaching English as a second language.
