Open House Survey

Responses collected were used to gauge scheduling preferences and program of study interests. The data collected showed that respondents prefer in-person courses (53%). Top enrollment factors included time of class, method of instruction, and instructor.

Graduate Exit Survey

Responses are used to collect graduate feedback on their experiences at BCC. Graduates highlighted classroom experiences, advising, campus events and campus services as having great positive impact but had ongoing needs with childcare and transportation. Top obstacles included financial struggles, mental health, and challenging coursework.

Committee Effectiveness Survey

This survey is administered to get feedback about the shared governance process and accomplishments of committees throughout the academic year. Committee members highlighted process improvements, strong discussions, positive team dynamics, and many committee accomplishments. Some members also shared areas for improvement.

Real College Survey - Basic Needs

BCC students experience higher rates of basic needs insecurity—including food insecurity, housing instability, and homelessness—compared to statewide averages. Students over 26 years of age, women, Black/African American students and students within small population ethnic groups show especially elevated levels of hardship. The data highlights substantial unmet needs that may affect students' stability, well-being, and academic success.

Campus Climate Survey

The RP Group conducted a survey on behalf of BCC, focusing on campus climate for students and staff. Topics from the survey included sentiments about sense of belonging, satisfaction, safety, burnout, racial tensions, discrimination and microaggressions, leadership effectiveness, and fair and equal treatment. Responses of both student's and staff showed a generally positive sentiment about the campus and campus culture.

Mental Health Survey

This survey was used to learn more about students' mental wellness and awareness of campus resources. Students reported high levels of stress, anxiety, and depression, but overall rates of mental health struggles have mostly improved since 2023. Many indicated interest in wellness resources—especially individual therapy, mental health assessment, workshops, and wellness coaching.
